Portsmouth SLA gold package - 39 days of support for staff over the year so each teacher had weekly training for half a term, including opportunities for children to access gym, dance and sport festivals. Opportunities provided and planned for children to participate; these included competitive opportunities in dance, gymnastics and cricket.
Investing in Real PE as a scheme to support staff in delivering PE	Raised the profile of PE and Sport across the school and developed staff confidence, knowledge and skills in teaching PE and Sport.
Termly Theme Weeks	Pupils were able to engage in an enhanced range of activities including Dance and Movement workshops.
