Dear Parents and Carers,

Thank you for continuing to adhere to social distancing restrictions. As many of yourselves, we were hoping for some lifting to enable us to go back to our traditional summer activities. We are still able to have an exciting end to the school year and are continuing to adapt to the circumstances.

Transition

Following national and citywide guidance, our transition activities will be virtual for all year groups. We will ensure that our September welcome is focused on wellbeing and induction. For the very small number of children moving elsewhere in September, where arrangements have been made for them to attend in person, they will need to quarantine for 48 hours afterwards before returning to school.

Year 6 Big City Read

We are pleased to be taking part in the 'Big City Read' initiative alongside other schools in Portsmouth and gifted a hardback copy of 'Boy Giant' by Michael Morpurgo to each of our Year 6 pupils on 'Empathy Day' on Thursday 10th June in recognition of the empathy theme in the book. The book promotes themes of kindness, hope and resilience that are especially pertinent in these times.

Michael sent the following message to all the schools taking part in the initiative: "Portsmouth looks out to the world. We think of all the people who sailed the seas over the centuries from Portsmouth and found new worlds, and we think of all the people who sailed the seas and found new homes here with us. We think that there are about 60 million refugees in this world of ours and some will end up on our shores. What's important is that they are welcomed as fellow human beings, not as refugees, that we acknowledge the sacrifices they have made just to get here. That is why I wrote Boy Giant and many other books that are about those children who most need family, a future and safety. This is an initiative that I am so pleased to be a part of. It's through books and libraries that many of us first meet these people, and first discover that they are simply the same as us and that we need each other."

Infant School fruit helpers for September 2021

Adult volunteers in school provide invaluable support to children and staff. We are recruiting regular volunteers who can help with the preparation /washing of fruit for the children's break time, to start in September 2021. This would take no longer than 30 minutes a day and can be done immediately after dropping your child to school. Leave of Absence requests

We are seeing a very high number of absence requests that are not exceptional. Although we understand the difficulties of planning a family holiday, this is not an exceptional circumstance. Requests should be submitted in good time. Please can we also remind you, that if you have a medical appointment, we need to be made aware of this in advance so that your child can be ready on time. We may require proof of request for leave.

SEND Survey does your child need extra support with learning?

Parents and carers of children with SEND praised city schools and keyworkers for their support in Portsmouth City Council's annual survey. 86% said they felt they were being listened to, with education staff being more often identified as the main keyworker that supports them.

However, it also showed about half of families are still not aware of Portsmouth's SEND Local Offer website, meaning some might be missing out on important and helpful support.
