# Who or What is a Governor? by Glynis Alexander, Joint Chair of Governors



Welcome to the part of the newsletter that will hopefully allow you all to know a little more about the individuals who make up the Governing Body of the Court Lane Schools.

My role at present (and for the past six years), is that of one of the Chair of Governors, a role that is chosen at the beginning of each school year and ratified by Chichester University Trust. I work with the two Headteachers, the Trust and my fellow Governors (which includes two members of staff, two parents and a number of co-opted governors). Our

Clerk keeps us within the law and under control making sure that we have a good understanding of all educational areas in both our meetings and in our monitoring.

A key part of our role is that we continually question when unsure, request further information to help decision making, seek clarification to support understanding and ensure value for money. We are encouraged to further our own knowledge by taking part in training sessions held by the Trust and local authorities whilst engaging in more specific areas of study through the National College. It supports us in being aware of the continuing development of educational concepts when discussing areas of your children's journey from Year R to 6 and beyond. All of this in order to assist the learning and welfare of all who study and work within the two schools.

Myself, I have been in education for over fifty years as a teacher and senior leader, in Junior, Middle and Secondary schools both in this country and abroad. Latterly I worked for several universities and schools training teachers, and have been a governor in total, for over 16 years. At present I am also the Chair of Governors in two other schools, a Junior and a large Secondary. This has further supported my understanding of the journey your children make and the way in which they learn and develop their skills through each stage.

As a person, I am a mother of two and grandmother of five whose ages range from 9 -21. In speaking to them I have been made very aware of how difficult these past two years have been, both academically and mentally for them and their families, and how important it is that we continue to give all the support and encouragement we can to help them move on. My admiration for the manner in which schools have modified the way in which have taught, both in school and by remote learning, knows no bounds. Many of the good ideas and changes that have come out of Lockdown will no doubt continue to be adapted to enhance the learning and development of the children in their care.

You can be assured that at the Court Lane Academies, the staff have your children at the heart in all they plan and do and are very aware of their precious cargo and the very important part you play in their development. Between us we can make such a difference to their futures.

As a Governing Body we are very proud of our staff and pupils for their continued determination, diligence and resolve to move forward and to aim high. We have all learnt from the past year or so, some things we will take on board, others we will leave behind. The Court Lane Schools will continue to grow and learn as a whole with your child at its heart.
