

Early Years Curriculum




The Unique Child reaches out to relate to people and things through the Characteristics of Effective Learning, which move through all areas of learning.

Prime areas are fundamental, work together, and move through to support development in all other areas.



- *Finding ways to solve problems.
- *Finding new ways to do things.
- *Reviewing how well the approach worked.



- *Using their senses to explore the world around them.
- *Pretending objects are things from their own experience.
- *Making links and noticing patterns in their experiences.





Risk Taking

- *Showing curiosity about objects, events and people.

Getting to know your child

Is your child school ready?

- Independence skills:

- Dress and undressing (including turning clothes back the right way, putting shoes on the correct feet, putting on tights and socks, putting on their own coat and taking off their own jumper)
- Toileting independently including wiping.
- Recognise their own name when it is written down.
- Opening packets such as crisps or fruit bags.
- Cutting their own food and using cutlery appropriately.
- Asking for help using their words not actions.

Social skills:

- Developing taking turns and sharing skills with others.
- Developing an awareness of their own emotions and how others are feeling.
- Developing their understanding for boundaries and behavioural expectations.
- Talking to others about themselves and their learning.
- Encouraged to ask and answer questions about things they are interested in.

Summer Holiday Challenges



Over the summer holidays work with your child to practise some of the most important skills to be ready to start school. Ask your child to colour in the ones they have achieved and bring it into school on their first day.

I can put my shoes on the correct feet without help.	I can recognise my name when it is written down.	I can find the front cover of a book without help.	I can put on my own coat without help.	I can zip up my own coat without help.
I can ask a question starting with who, what, where, when, why or how.	I can go to the toilet without help and wipe myself independently.	I can take off all of my clothes and dress myself again without help.	I can take off my own jumper and turn it the correct way without help.	I can hold scissors correctly and cut different patterns and around different shapes.
I can say all of my colours and recognise them in the things around me.	I can say if I am sad, happy, excited, worried or angry and why.	I can turn the pages of a book without help.	I can write my name with a capital letter at the beginning.	I can wait for a short time if an adult is busy and I need something.
I can listen to a story that is being read to me.	I can use different tenses to talk about my experiences.	I can talk about where things are using above, below and next to.	I can wash and dry my hands with soap, without help.	I can count to 5 and point to each number when I say it.
I can say 3 or 4 words that rhyme together.	I can tell an adult what I have drawn or written.	I can count my steps, jumps or claps.	I can sing some familiar songs and make up actions.	I can share my toys with other children.

- Bookbags only
 - No need to purchase any equipment such as pens etc, all this is provided in each class.
- Water bottles are provided at the beginning of the year and not replaced by school if broken.

Miss School, Miss Out!

Regular attendance at school is a key factor in opening up more opportunities in adult life. Good attendance helps children to make good progress in school and fulfil their potential in life.



One of the most important ways a parent can support the education of their child and the child's social, emotional and academic development is to ensure they attend every day and on time and avoid any unauthorised absences.

Going to school regularly and being part of the school community gives children and young people a sense of belonging and means that they benefit not only from lessons and learning, but also can see friends and teachers.

Parents and carers are legally responsible for making sure their children attend school regularly and schools can offer help and support to any families who are struggling with attendance for any reason.




The government expects

Schools and local authorities to:

- promote good attendance and reduce absence, including persistent absence
- ensure every pupil has access to fulltime education to which they are entitled
- act early to address patterns of absence

Parents to:

- perform their legal duty by ensuring their children of compulsory school age who are registered at school attend regularly
- all pupils to be punctual to their lessons





The Importance of Attendance

- Avoiding holidays in term time
- Attendance less than 90% will be followed up with a letter from school.
- Punctuality is key to ensuring your child settles into school and does not miss the important start to the day.



Free School Meals



- Universal Infant Free School meals
- All infant age pupils are eligible for a free school meal
- A menu is available that you can pre order from in advance or your pupil can order in class on the day.
