## Reading and Phonics at Court Lane Infant Academy 23-24

At Court Lane Infant Academy we use a Reading and Phonics scheme called Little Wandle Letters and Sounds Revised. This ensures that our approach to reading and phonics follows up to date guidance on how to teach children to read. Little Wandle Letters and Sounds is a Systematic Synthetic Phonics ( **SSP** ) programme.

#### **Phonics**

As part of daily phonics lessons your child will focus on learning letters and sounds. They will also begin to practise reading simple words before progressing through the scheme to spell longer words and write sentences. Phonics is essential in helping your child to learn to read. Daily phonics lessons take place at Court Lane Infant Academy promptly at the start of the school day. It is therefore imperative that your child arrives punctually for school so that they do not miss these lessons.

### Reading

You can have a huge impact on your child's reading journey by continuing their practise at home.

There are two types of reading book that your child may bring home:

# An electronic Collins Big Cat Reading Practice Book.

This will be at the correct phonic stage for your child and in Year R children will begin by sharing wordless books before progressing to books with simple words and eventually books with sentences. Progressing to worded books requires your child to develop fluency and independence. Children are allocated their electronic books on a Friday after they have read the book in school in their reading practice sessions. All books have instructions to support you in guiding your child at home. When on worded books these should be read fluently and independently by your child. You will receive a letter containing the login details for accessing these books.

## A sharing book.

Your child may not be able to read this on their own. This book is for you **both** to read and **enjoy together.** Books that your child chooses from the library are also books to share and enjoy.
